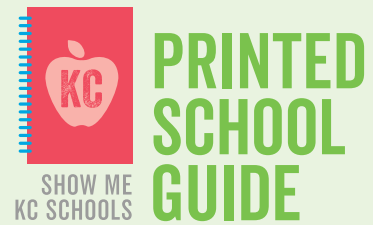

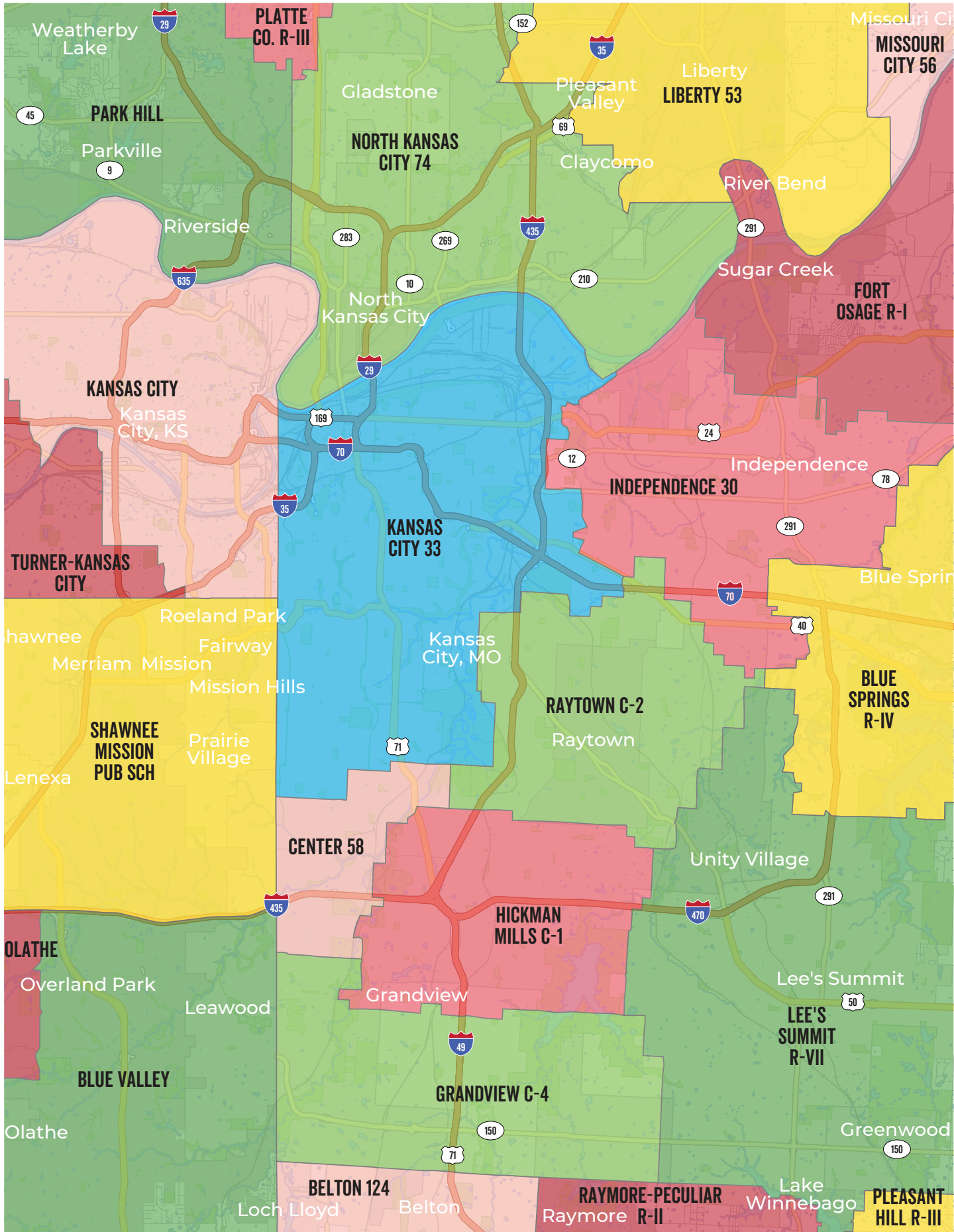

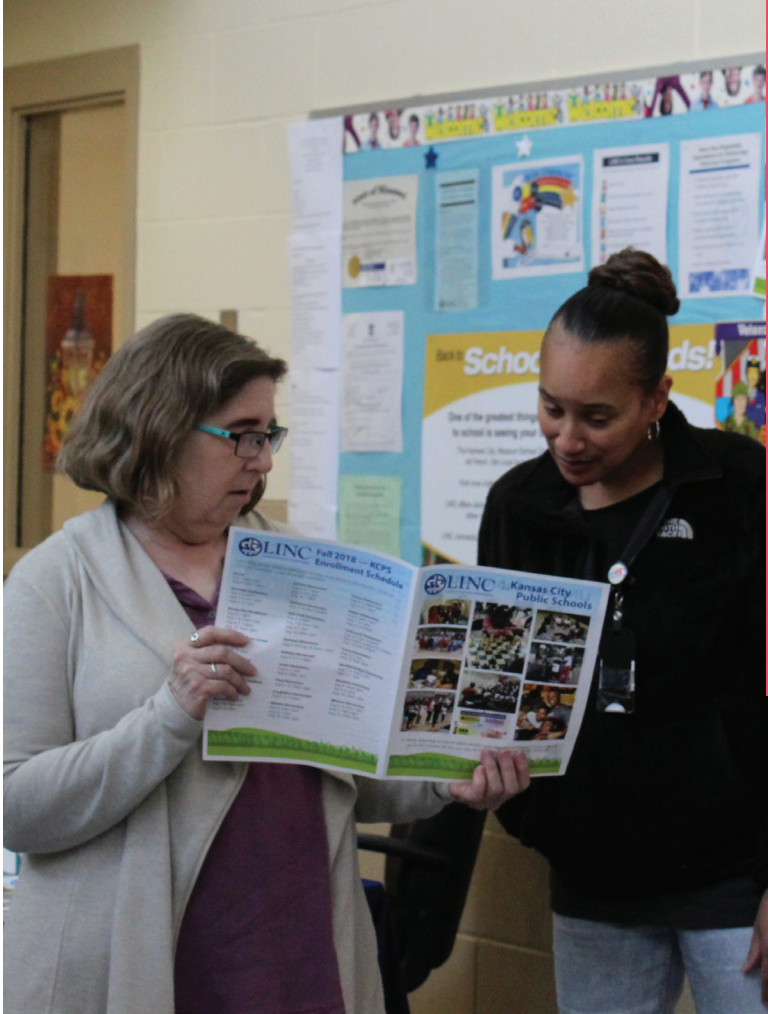

# PRE-K PROGRAMS

Kansas City has many options if you are looking for Pre-K for your child! When exploring, first learn about your options and consider where you might like your child to attend Kindergarten. Also, consider your ability to pay, as some options are free and some require families to pay all or some of the cost.

TIP!

We use the term “Pre-K” to refer to the classroom education options for 3 and 4 year olds, which are typically the 2 years before a child enters kindergarten. You may also hear the words “preschool” or “early childhood education” or “child care” used to mean something similar. Always ask for clarification to make sure you understand what a program includes.

**FREE** Pre-K seats are available through Kansas City Public Schools, Charter Schools and community-based providers. Some of these seats are for children who qualify based on income. It is best to go through the application process to see if you qualify. You will be asked to either fill out a “free and reduced lunch” form or provide proof of income documents.

**The Kansas City Public School district** offers **FREE** Pre-K in 4 different settings for students as young as 3 years old:

- 1. Neighborhood elementary school Pre-K classrooms
- 2. Early childhood centers (Woodland and Richardson)
- 3. Montessori preschool programs (Border Star and Holliday)
- 4. Off-site partner locations (through the Pre-K Cooperative - see page 12).

**Charter schools** also often have **FREE** Pre-K options in various settings for children as young as 3 years old:

- 1. Pre-K classrooms at elementary schools (Academy for Integrated Arts, Brookside Charter School, Frontier School of Innovation, Guadalupe Centers Schools)
- 2. Off-site partner locations (through the Pre-K Cooperative- see page 12)

**Some private schools** have tuition-based Pre-K. As you explore this guide, you will see that some schools list grade levels that start at “PK.” If you are interested in learning more, reach out directly to any of the schools in this guide.

TRANSPORTATION

Most early childhood and preschool programs do not provide transportation. Even though some Pre-K programs are connected to elementary schools, bus transportation usually begins at kindergarten. However, if your child qualifies for early childhood special education they may also qualify for transportation.



Whether you are seeking full-time childcare or a part-time preschool option, the right spot for your early learner is out there waiting for you! Follow these steps to ensure you explore all of your options:

STEP #1

Some Pre-K programs are connected to elementary schools, so if you have an idea of where you want your child to attend kindergarten, check with that school to see if they have a Pre-K program that your child is eligible for. Students who participate in these Pre-K programs may have a priority in that school's lottery process for kindergarten.

STEP #2

Head Start  
MID-AMERICA REGIONAL COUNCIL

Does your child qualify for **FREE** Pre-K through Head Start? Head Start is a federally funded program for children ages birth through 5 years. Eligibility is based on income and other factors. Several early education centers in Kansas City are “Head Start” sites.

**THE KC PRE-K COOPERATIVE** is an innovative partnership between community-based early childhood providers and public schools that offers free, high-quality Pre-K for income eligible families living in Kansas City, MO. Serving 3-year-olds to 5-year-olds, the Cooperative's Pre-K classrooms build the essential academic, social, and emotional skills that students need to thrive in Kindergarten and that establish a solid foundation for future success in the classroom and beyond.

**EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT**

While enrolling your child in Pre-K is one great way to support early development, remember that **YOU** are your child's first teacher! There are many **FREE** early childhood programs and resources available that you can access from home. Below are some ways to help you understand and support your child's early development - which is a great way to make sure they are on track to being ready for kindergarten!

1. Complete a free online developmental screening (children 4 months to 6 years) for your child and receive their results from a local early childhood professional by visiting [www.startatzero.org/asq](http://www.startatzero.org/asq).
2. Download the free "Milestone Tracker App" (children 2 months to 5 years) from [www.cdc.gov](http://www.cdc.gov) to make sure your child is meeting their developmental milestones.
3. Don't forget to check out early childhood resources in the community around you! Your local branch of the KC Public Library is a great place to go for story time and other early childhood activities and resources. [www.kclibrary.org](http://www.kclibrary.org).

**HOME VISITING PROGRAMS**

Supporting your child's early education starts at home! Home visiting programs partner a family with a parent educator/early childhood professional who provides coaching and education related to parenting a baby or young child and can also provide comprehensive support and connections to services and opportunities depending on your family's needs. Check out the list of **FREE** local home visiting programs.



**Parents as Teachers** is a program offered through the Kansas City Public Schools district and includes home visiting and other early childhood family services.

# KANSAS CITY SCHOOL OPTIONS

There are five types of schools available to children living in the boundaries of the Kansas City Public Schools.

1

### NEIGHBORHOOD SCHOOLS

Neighborhood schools are tuition-free public schools that are part of Kansas City Public Schools (KCPS). Any child who lives in the KCPS boundaries, is guaranteed a seat at their neighborhood school. Sometimes families choose to request a neighborhood school in a different neighborhood and this request is granted by KCPS when space allows.

2

### SIGNATURE SCHOOLS

Signature schools are tuition-free public schools and they are also part of KCPS. Each signature school has its own specific focus, such as Montessori, language immersion, African culture, performing arts, or college prep. They are open to any student who lives in the KCPS boundaries but do have admission requirements and a limited number of seats. If applications exceed the number of seats available a lottery will be held after the application deadline.

3

### PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOLS

Charter schools are tuition-free public schools that operate independently of KCPS. They receive state funding, just like district schools, and are open to all students in the KCPS boundaries. If applications exceed the number of seats available a lottery will be held after the application deadline.

4

### FAITH-BASED SCHOOLS

Faith-based schools are affiliated with a religious organization. Students usually have religious education in addition to their secular subjects. Faith-based schools do not receive public funding so they usually charge tuition. Many are also supported by the religious organization with which they are affiliated which may help keep tuition cost down and financial aid may be available. Students apply for admission to faith-based schools which are governed by a board of directors and the religious organization with which they are affiliated.

### INDEPENDENT PRIVATE SCHOOLS

Independent private schools are supported by a private organization or individuals rather than the government. Independent private schools do not receive public funding so they charge tuition, although financial aid may be available. They are open to students regardless of where they live. Students apply for admission to independent private schools which are governed by a board of directors.

REMEMBER NOVEMBER!

- The second Saturday in November is always the City School Fair.
- The first day of the application for SchoolAppKC and the schools within the platform, will always take place at the city school fair as well.
- Additionally most private and parochial schools begin to accept applications at this time. It's also good time to start to ask when the district will open their application platform which will begin some time around the end of November.

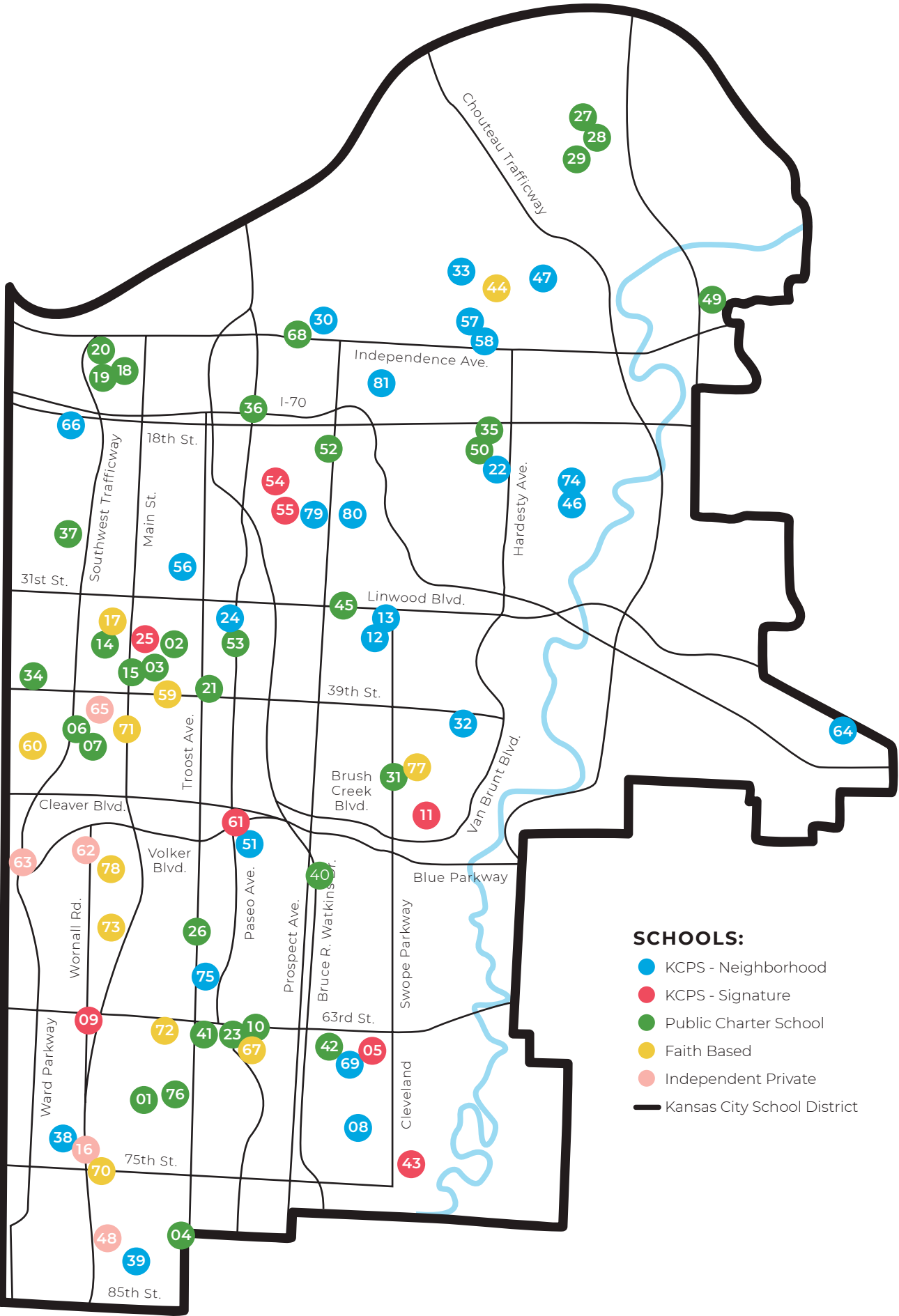

## SPECIALIZED SERVICES AND PROGRAMS

Kansas City Schools offer several programs for students needing or interested in specialized instruction. This guide provides a brief summary. Please contact the programs listed below for more information.

### STUDENTS EXPERIENCING HOUSELESSNESS

Students are entitled by law to continue at their schools even if their family becomes houseless during the school year. According to the McKinney-Vento Act, schools must make provisions for children and families who are in this position including providing free transportation to and from school even if a student is staying outside of the school district boundaries. It is the responsibility of the family to inform their child's school about their housing status so that the school can begin providing necessary services.

### STUDENTS LEARNING ENGLISH

**English Language Learner (ELL)** support is designed to help students who are learning English as a second language develop necessary academic skills. English as a Second Language (ESL) programs are designed to teach students who speak languages other than English how to understand, speak, read and write in English and to support students' culture and language whenever possible. All public schools offer support for English language learners.

### STUDENTS DESIRING AN EARLY START ON COLLEGE

**Early College Academy** is a partnership between the Kansas City Public Schools and Metropolitan Community College – Penn Valley for highly motivated high school students who are ready to participate in the rigors of college. Students earn high school credits while also earning college credits as they attend classes, full-time, on a college campus.

### STUDENTS LOOKING FOR CAREER AND TECHNICAL TRAINING

**Manual Career and Technical Center (MCTC)** is a center for KCPS high school students and charter school students. Students generally attend MCTC for a portion of the day during their 11th or 12th grade years in addition to taking classes at their high schools. MCTC offers career and technical programs at three sites that are taught by professionals who are experts in their fields and often include partnerships with local companies.

Sometimes referred to as vo-tech education, MCTC prepares students to enter a highly educated workforce or to begin post-secondary education. Manual Career Technical Center is a designated “Technology Center that Works” site.

# STUDENTS REQUIRING AN ALTERNATE SETTING TO ACHIEVE SCHOOL SUCCESS

## KANSAS CITY VIRTUAL ACADEMY (KCVA)

### Serving grades K-12

Students complete virtual courses 100% online and have 24/7 access to lessons that are fully aligned to the Missouri Learning Standards. Students work independently with the support of a KCPS teacher. Because taking online courses is different from taking courses in a traditional face-to-face classroom, it's good for students to know what courses will entail and what kind of support they'll need to be successful. Research shows that students who are well prepared and well supported for this new experience do better in their classes.

## SUCCESS ACADEMIES AT KNOTTS (K-6) AND ANDERSON (7-12)

**Success Academies at Knotts** offer enrollment to students who are moving into KCPS and have attended alternative schools outside of the Kansas City Public Schools, as well as to students already in KCPS who will benefit from a consistent school environment.

Both schools encourage reaching academic goals, improved attendance rates, increased parent involvement, transformed behavior, and developing citizenship. The Success Academies do not graduate students, rather they prepare them to return to other schools in the district.

## EVENING ACADEMY

**Evening Academy** is a high school program designed for students looking for a flexible pathway toward graduation. Students will earn credits toward a traditional high school diploma. Students can enroll as a full time Evening Academy student, part-time student, or dual-enrolled student. Students who are behind can catch up in a safe, supportive environment while being dual-enrolled at their home high school or enrolled as a full time Evening Academy student. Students can also create room in their schedule for additional courses and electives by taking credits through Evening Academy.

## THE MISSOURI OPTION PROGRAM

**The Missouri Option Program** was designed by the State of Missouri as an alternative for high school graduation. The program was developed for seniors who have gotten into a position of not being able to graduate with their graduation class. The program specifically targets those students who are 17 years of age or older and are at least one year behind their cohort group or for other significant reasons identified in the local Missouri Option Program plan.

## MIDDLE COLLEGE

**Middle College** is for students looking for an unconventional path for high school graduation and a college education. Designed for students 17-24 years old who dropped out of the KCPS system, students who enroll in Middle College are typically missing just a couple credits from graduating. Through this program, students earn their high school diploma or GED and then build college and career skills. The partnership between Kansas City Public Schools (KCPS), Full Employment Council and MCC-Penn Valley Community College offers students a blended learning instructional model that will utilize Gradpoint online coursework and direct instruction to provide students the necessary support needed for academic success.

## HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY TEST

**The Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** selected a new high school equivalency test that replaced the GED starting January 2014. Missouri's current high school equivalency test was developed by the Educational Testing Service (ETS) and is called the HiSET®.

## HOMESCHOOLING

**The Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** does not regulate or monitor home schooling. There is no registration required with the state. There is no program for the inspection, approval, or accreditation of home schools in Missouri.



# SPECIAL EDUCATION

It is the right of all children with disabilities in the United States to have Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE). This is guaranteed by the federal government under the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the Individuals with Disabilities Act (IDEA).

### INDIVIDUALIZED EDUCATION PLAN (IEP)

FAPE and IDEA mean that all public schools (both district and charter) must create a specialized academic plan, referred to as an Individualized Education Plan (IEP), for children with special needs. They must do this within 30 calendar days after the child is determined eligible. However, it is important to remember that just because a child has a disability or impairment, they may not automatically qualify for special education services. The IEP process must be followed in order to qualify and receive services.

TIP!

Facilitated IEP (FIEP) meetings are now available by request through the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education's website. Parents and school personnel are finding that the use of an independent facilitator can assist in the IEP team process. A facilitator is a neutral person who helps guide the student-centered focus of the meeting.

### 504 PLAN

Some students with disabilities may not require an IEP under the IDEA, however, they may qualify for a 504 plan under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973. A 504 plan is a blueprint or plan for how a child will have access to learning at school. It provides services and changes to the learning environment to meet the needs of the child as adequately as other students.

To qualify for a 504 plan, there are two requirements:

1. A child has any disability, which can include many learning or attention issues.
2. The disability must interfere with the child's ability to learn in a general education classroom.

Section 504 has a broader definition of a disability than IDEA. It says a disability must substantially limit one or more basic life activities, such as learning. Therefore, a child who doesn't qualify for an IEP might still be able to get a 504 plan.

# KCPS FEEDER SYSTEM

## KCPS NEIGHBORHOOD SCHOOLS

Neighborhood schools are tuition-free public schools that are part of Kansas City Public Schools (KCPS). Any child who lives in the KCPS boundaries, is guaranteed a seat at their neighborhood school. Sometimes families choose to request a neighborhood school in a different neighborhood and this request is granted by KCPS when space allows.

Kansas City Public Schools have a path that aims to keep students who are in the same neighborhood elementary school together for their whole K-12 career. Students who attend elementary or middle school at a KCPS *signature* school, can jump onto this path when they're ready for high school.

# UNDERSTANDING PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOLS

## WHAT IS A PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL?

Charter schools are tuition-free public schools, independent of the school district, that are equally open to all children who live in a geographic area.

## WHO OVERSEES CHARTER SCHOOLS?

Public charter schools are accountable to the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE), their public charter sponsors and, of course, to their children and families. In Kansas City, all public charter schools are non-profit. There are no for-profit public charter school operators in Kansas City.

## WHAT IS A CHARTER SCHOOL SPONSOR?

In Missouri, sponsors are institutions or organizations that provide oversight to public charter schools. Each public charter school has a contract (a "charter") with a sponsor that spells out what the school will do, what it expects to achieve, how it will evaluate its success (or failure) and what the consequences are for not reaching goals. The sponsor's job is to make sure that charter schools are complying with the law and also with their contract. The sponsor decides whether or not a school's charter will be renewed. A school without a renewed charter will be closed.

### INFO:

Kansas City Public Charter schools are free public schools open to all students living in the Kansas City Public Schools boundaries. They do not require an admissions test, transcripts, interviews, or essays in order to simply apply.



# THE KC PARENTS’ BILL OF RIGHTS FOR EDUCATION

## PARENTS BILL OF RIGHTS

As a parent or guardian of a child living in the Kansas City Public Schools boundaries, I have the right to:

1. Receive timely, clear communication from official school channels in regards to all policies, disciplinary actions, grades, processes, application and enrollment guidelines, staffing changes, and incidents that may affect my child's education.
2. Be provided with information that explains curriculum, teaching methods, testing and scores, classroom schedules, and individual student evaluation processes.
3. Be actively engaged in ways that are meaningful to my family and to be viewed as an asset and a partner in my child's learning process. This includes visiting my child's classroom when appropriate.
4. Have my child learn in an environment free from physical, emotional, or psychological harm. In the event that harm is caused, I have the right to clear processes for communication and resolution.
5. Be seen as my child's first educator and to raise my child with the culture, traditions, and values that are important to my family and for those to be honored, welcomed, and supported.
6. Transparency about how my child's school is funded and governed.
7. Advocate for my child without fear of repercussions. To review their record and appeal any information that is incorrect.
8. Have access to my child's teacher, school administration and principals either in person, by phone, or electronically for the purpose of helping my child.
9. Have a clear, efficient, and accessible process for resolving problems.
10. Have access to any services that may help my child be successful in school, whether they are Title 1, IEP, 504 plans, medical attention, translation services, houseless or transitional housing services, and/or counseling.

## RESPONSIBILITIES OF PARENTS

As a parent or guardian of a child living in the Kansas City Public Schools boundaries, I have the responsibility to:

1. Send my child to school well rested and ready to learn.
2. Ensure my child attends school regularly and on time.
3. Be aware of my child's work, progress, and problems by reading notices from the school, talking to my child about school, reviewing work and grade cards, attending conferences, and maintaining open lines of communication with school staff.
4. Adhere to all school policies and regulations as they pertain to my child's education and learning environment.
5. Respond in a timely manner to any communications that are sent home.
6. Enter and exit the school building in a respectful manner, refraining from disruptive or abusive behavior and to treat all staff members with courtesy and respect.
7. Ensure that the school is updated with accurate emergency contact information for my child.
8. Make every effort to attend all meetings and conferences requested by the school that pertains to my child's education and needs.
9. Seek understanding when incidents might occur by not making assumptions, asking questions first, and responding using appropriate channels.

## HELPFUL STEPS FOR PROBLEM SOLVING

Challenges arise at every school – you are not alone. Keep the following information on hand so that when issues arise you can contact the right person:

- School telephone number and front office manager’s name.
- Teacher and principal's email addresses.
- PTA president name, telephone number and email address, if applicable.

Before situations escalate or you post your grievance on social media, seek to gain all perspectives. If a problem still exists, consider following the steps below for positive outcomes for everyone.

STEP #1

Talk to your child's teacher. Please be patient when scheduling meetings – these can take a few days. If an in-person conversation is not possible, schedule a time to discuss your problem or concern over the phone. In the meantime, keep track of your communication and of anything you receive in return with dates and names.

STEP #2

Present your concern to the next level. He/she will be able to be more helpful if you share the steps you've already taken with the staff member closest to the problem. Take time to openly share with them the reasons why you feel uncomfortable dealing directly with the person who is closest to the situation.

STEP #3

Contact the building principal, superintendent, or the head of school. You should be able to arrange a meeting or a telephone conversation through the school's office.

STEP #4

The final step is to go to the board of directors for your school or district. This should be used as a last effort. You can ask to be placed on the agenda of their regular meetings. This will be a public presentation. Be prepared to present your issue and to provide supporting documentation. No matter how difficult the situation may feel, remember that schools do want to work with parents to resolve problems for students.

Tuition at private schools in Kansas City varies widely. Some private schools base their tuition on a family’s ability to pay. Many, especially those that are affiliated with a religious organization, have tuition that is supplemented by the organization. Still others rely on tuition as the main source of money to cover the expenses of a child’s education.

## HOW MUCH DOES A SCHOOL COST?

Most faith-based and independent private schools state their annual tuition amounts on their websites. Many also include other fees and costs that are in addition to tuition. We list the base tuition for these schools on our website ([www.showmekcschools.org](http://www.showmekcschools.org)) so you can find them all in one place.

## WHAT IF I CAN'T AFFORD THAT?

Most private schools offer financial aid of some kind and also offer discounts for siblings in the same family.

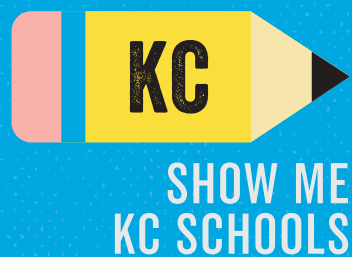

## SCHOOLAPPKC FAQ'S

### Q: How do I apply?

Submit an application at [www.schoolappkc.org](http://www.schoolappkc.org). Create a family profile, fill out a few short questions, then select the schools you want your child to attend.

### Q: How long does it take to apply online?

Typically, the application process should take less than 5 minutes. Once you are offered and accept a seat, the school will follow up with you about its enrollment process.

### Q: What if I do not have access to a computer?

You can submit the application from a mobile device or you can contact a SchoolAppKC school for assistance. Please call Show Me KC Schools Navigations Services at (816) 535-0656.

### Q: How many schools can I apply to?

You can apply to as many as you would like, but we encourage you to learn about all the options and apply to the schools you think are best for your child.

### Q: Can I accept a seat at more than one school?

No, families must choose one school. Once you select a school, the other offers will expire, but your waitlist spots will not disappear until you remove yourself.

### Q: How do schools decide who gets in?

Lotteries will be conducted at schools that have more applicants than available seats. Students with siblings attending any given school do receive sibling preference. Some schools also offer priorities for children of staff members, and some schools give geographic or zip code preferences. Contact each school you are interested in to learn more about their admissions policies.

### Q: How do I know if I get in?

If your child is offered a seat, the SchoolAppKC system will automatically notify you after the lottery by text and/or email. You will need to log into your account to accept the offer and then complete the enrollment process at that school to secure your child's seat.

### Q: What happens if I miss the deadline?

You can still apply to participating schools after the deadline. If a school has space available, you will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.

For schools that do not have space available, you will be placed on a waitlist in the order that your application was received.

### Q: My child already has a school, do they still need to apply?

You only need to apply using SchoolAppKC if your child is interested in attending a different school for the new school year than they currently attend. If your child is planning to stay at their current school, consult your school's re-enrollment policy.

### Q: What do I do if I am waitlisted?

Do not be discouraged if you are on a waitlist. As other families accept and decline seats, you will see your waitlist number fluctuate. If you have your heart set on a school you are welcome to remain on a waitlist; however, there is no guarantee a seat will open.

### Q: Can I accept a seat at a school while remaining on a waitlist of another school?

Yes! You can accept a seat and still remain on waitlists at other schools, but you can only accept one offer at a time.

### Q: Is SchoolAppKC open to anyone?

# ENROLLKC.ORG FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

## WHAT DO I NEED TO APPLY?

For the first step of the application process, we need parent/guardian name, address, phone number, email address, student name, student grade, student ID number (if applicable) and school choices. Once complete, you will receive an email confirming your application.

## HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE TO APPLY?

The initial application process takes approximately 5 to 10 minutes to complete. Once seats are offered, the registration process will take approximately 20 to 30 minutes to complete, including uploading documentation and finalizing contact information.

## HOW CAN I COMPLETE THE APPLICATION IF I DON'T HAVE A COMPUTER OR INTERNET?

The application can be completed on a smart phone, tablet or Chromebook. Parents may visit our Admissions Department in our Board of Education building at 2901 Troost Ave., Kansas City, MO from 8:00 am until 4:00 pm, Monday thru Friday. We have kiosks set up to help with applications along with a friendly staff to answer your questions.

## WHAT ARE MY OPTIONS IF I MISS THE FEBRUARY DEADLINE?

You can still apply! Applications received after the February deadline will be put on a wait list on a first come, first-served basis. ## CAN I APPLY TO MORE THAN ONE SCHOOL?

Yes! You can apply to your neighborhood school, plus, three Signature Schools for each student.

## CAN MY STUDENT ENROLL AT ANY GRADE?

Students may enter our Neighborhood Schools at any grade level. For our Signature Schools, each school has different entrance requirements. For Foreign Language Academy and Carver Dual Language School, students may enter at kindergarten. After kindergarten, students must demonstrate grade-level proficiency in the foreign language. For Border Star Montessori and Harold Holliday, Sr. Montessori, students are welcome to join the school in Pre-K age 3, Pre-K age 4 or kindergarten. After kindergarten, students must have prior Montessori experience.

## WHO CAN ATTEND A SIGNATURE SCHOOL?

Any student who lives within the Kansas City Public Schools attendance boundary and meets the school's enrollment requirements can attend a Signature School.

# SCHOOL DEMOGRAPHICS

Here at Show Me KC Schools our mission is to help you know your options and find the right individual school for your child.

But occasionally we think it’s helpful to take a step back and look at our district as a whole to see how the individual choices families make all fit together. What decisions are parents and caregivers making with respect to public schools? How many students attend our public schools? And what are the enrollment trends shaping K-12 public education in our district today?

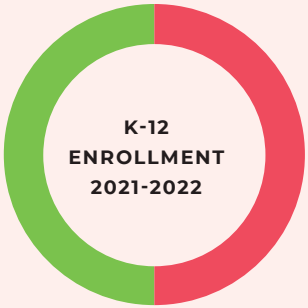
1. Half of all K-12 public school students attend KCPS schools, and half attend public charter schools.

In the 2021-22 school year, 26,573 total students attended K-12 schools within KCPS boundaries. 13,219 attended KCPS schools 13,354 attended charter schools.

2. 65% of all public K-12 students attend public “schools of choice”/choice-based schools.

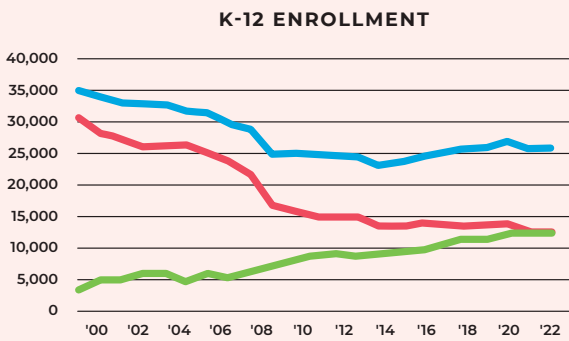
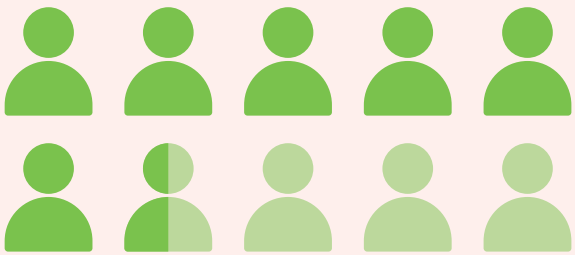
Public charter schools and KCPS signature schools are both “schools of choice” – that is, they are application-based public schools other than the neighborhood school to which a child would normally be assigned based on where they live.

When you add up both public charter enrollment and KCPS enrollment, 65% of students (17,355 of 26,573) attend choice-based public schools. The remaining 35% are enrolled in neighborhood schools.

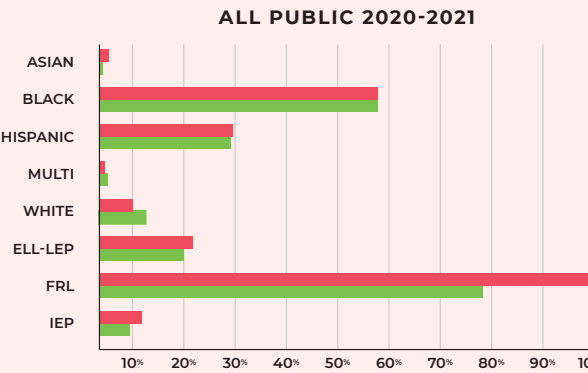

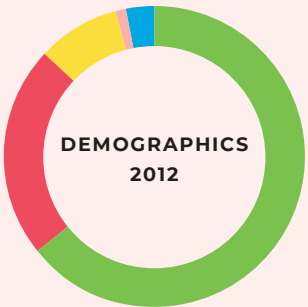
NEARLY 7 OF 10 PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS ATTEND A CHOICE-BASED PUBLIC SCHOOL

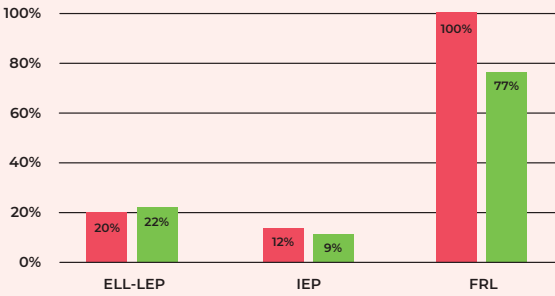

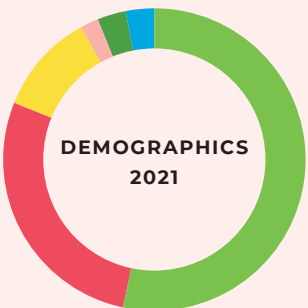

THE DEMOGRAPHICS OF KCPS AND PUBLIC CHARTERS ARE VERY SIMILAR

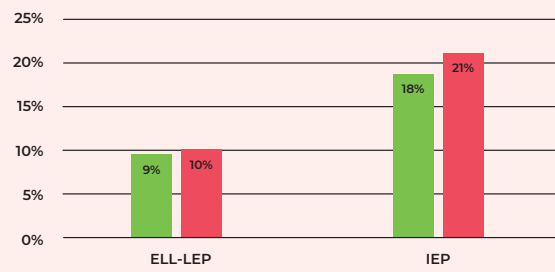

**3. The overall demographics of our public school sectors, both KCPS and public charter are, in aggregate, very similar.**

The overall racial and ethnic make-up of both KCPS and public charter schools are quite similar. The biggest differences can be found in Special Education (IEP); English Language Learning – Limited English Proficiency (ELL-LEP); and Free and Reduced Lunch (FRL) eligibility, which is a proxy for economic need. In these categories, overall, KCPS serves a higher needs student population.

These aggregate numbers are useful in that they tell us what our K-12 schools looks like overall. It's important to note, however, that these numbers can mask significant differences between schools, regardless of school type. For example, there are public charter schools that serve greater ELL populations than KCPS schools; KCPS schools that serve higher IEP populations than public charters– and every combination in between. Bottom line? It's impossible to make blanket generalizations about schools; each of our public schools serves a unique student population.

**4. The demographics of our school district are changing.**

The demographics of our K-12 public schools are changing. Enrollment of Hispanic/Latinx students is growing, and now makes up 29% of all K-12 student. Multiracial and White student enrollment is growing (DESE only started collecting Multiracial data in 2011). The percentage of ELL students in our district has also grown.

At the same time, overall enrollment of Black/African American students has decreased over the last decade.

Most enrollment growth over the last decade has been in public charter schools, which, as a sector, now constitute 50% of all public school enrollment. The below graph illustrates this shift in enrollment patterns over time. KCPS remains the single biggest operator of public schools in our district.

Prior to the coronavirus pandemic in 2020 and the subsequent dip in public school enrollment, Kansas City enjoyed several consecutive years of overall K-12 enrollment growth. As our community recovers, and parents and caregivers continue to learn more about public school options within KCPS boundaries, Show Me KC Schools looks forward to this growth resuming.

Those of us living within KCPS district boundaries live in a choice-based public school system. As any parent or caregiver of a school-age child can tell you, this choice-based system offers both advantages and disadvantages. It's wonderful to have a diverse set of school options for our diverse community of learners. But navigating a complicated school landscape to find the best quality school option can be incredibly difficult, as well as time-consuming. As a result, issues of access and equity are top of mind in everything we do at Show Me KC Schools.

We are here to help. As we look forward to the coming school years, Show Me KC Schools remains committed to helping all Kansas City families know their options and find the right individual school for their child.

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

**Q: Does the Kansas City Public Schools (KCPS) district serve everyone who lives in Kansas City, Missouri?**

No. There are 14 other school districts that serve Kansas City, Missouri. They are: Belton, Blue Springs, Center, Grandview, Hickman Mills, Independence, Kearney, Lee’s Summit, Liberty, North Kansas City, Park Hill, Platte County, Raytown, and Smithville.

KCPS operates 31 schools from elementary through high school. These include 7 signature schools and 24 neighborhood schools. (These 31 schools are covered in this guide along with charter, faith-based and independent private schools.)

**Q: When I was growing up, we just went to the schools nearby. Won’t my child just go to the school closest to where they live?**

In Kansas City, there are options – neighborhood, signature, charter, faith-based and independent private schools. Students living within the KCPS boundaries are guaranteed a spot in their neighborhood school and many people choose this option. Show Me KC Schools exists to help you know all of the options available in order to find a right fit for your child and family.

**Q: I don’t live in the KCPS district – can I still attend a Kansas City neighborhood, signature or public charter school?**

No. Both KCPS and all charter schools require that the student live in the KCPS boundaries. Please refer to the map of School Districts on page 4 or visit [www.showmekcschools.org](http://www.showmekcschools.org).

**Q: I am moving to Kansas City, Missouri and don’t have an address yet. What are my options?**

Welcome to Kansas City! Please check with individual schools to see how they might be able to accommodate you.

**Q: What is the age requirement for a child to enroll in Kindergarten in a Kansas City school?**

A child must be 5 years old by August 31 to enroll in a KCPS Kindergarten.

For public charter schools in Kansas City, the cut-off dates for turning 5 years old vary between July 31 and October 31.

Private schools determine their own cut-off dates. For the most part, private schools’ cut-off dates fall over the summer – typically between July 1st and August 31st.

To learn about specific schools, please visit individual profiles in this guide.

**Q: I have more than one child. Can they all go to the same school?**

Most schools do offer priority for siblings. Once one of your children is enrolled, the others will have priority over families that are new to a school.

**Q: How does school transportation work? Is my child eligible?**

**KCPS SCHOOLS:**  
Students who live half a mile or more from their neighborhood or signature school are eligible for transportation. They will have a bus stop within two blocks of their address. Students who live less than half a mile from their school are not eligible. The safe transport of these students to and from school is the responsibility of the parent or guardian. District transportation is not provided for Pre-K students or students who elect to attend a neighborhood school other than their resident neighborhood school.

**PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOLS:**  
The majority of charter schools provide transportation. Charter schools have individual transportation policies – some provide door-to-door transportation, some have central pick-up and drop off locations and others do not have a school bus, but may help provide city bus passes. Please check the individual school listings in this guide book or on our website ([www.showmekcschools.org](http://www.showmekcschools.org)) to confirm whether or not transportation is provided.

**FAITH-BASED AND INDEPENDENT PRIVATE SCHOOLS:**  
The majority of faith-based and independent private schools do not provide transportation. School directories are often shared in order for families to find others near them with whom to set up carpools. Please check the individual school listings in this guide book or on our website ([www.showmekcschools.org](http://www.showmekcschools.org)) to confirm whether or not transportation is provided.

**Q: What are my options if I don’t get my first choice of school?**

It is a good idea to apply to multiple schools. With the exception of your neighborhood school, there is no guarantee in a given year that your child will get a place at a particular school. Some schools have waitlists and you are welcome to stay on a waitlist until a spot opens for your student.



# GLOSSARY OF EDUCATION TERMS

The school search process often brings with it vocabulary and ideas that may be new to you. This glossary is meant to help clear the confusion. We'd love your help expanding this glossary on our website and in future guides! **504 PLAN**  
A 504 plan is a blueprint or plan for how a child will have access to learning at school. It provides services and changes to the learning environment to meet the needs of the child as adequately as other students.

**AP (ADVANCED PLACEMENT)**  
AP is a program created by a non-profit organization called College Board that offers college-level school work (AP classes) and exams (AP tests) to high school students. Many colleges and universities in the United States grant placement and course credit to students who earn high scores on their AP tests.

**BIST (BEHAVIOR INTERVENTION SUPPORT TEAM)**  
BIST is a behavior management system that was developed in Kansas City. It is used in some schools to minimize classroom disruptions through a series of clear steps designed to help students learn to manage their own behavior.

**CTE / IRC / RWL**  
Career Tech Education (CTE)  
Industry-Recognized Credentials (IRC)  
Real World Learning Certificates (RWL)  
These certificates are recognized in many job fields. Students graduating with their high school diploma and these certificates can enter directly into the workforce, such as construction, healthcare and information technology.

**CHILD CARE**  
Usually used when the program is designed to cover the parents/caregivers work hours. May or may not include a curriculum, and can start at birth and continue through early elementary.

**CHILD CARE SUBSIDY**  
Special pricing or assistance with child care payments for eligible families based on household size and income. For more information on eligibility and to apply in Missouri, visit the Missouri Department of Social Services website at [www.dss.mo.gov](http://www.dss.mo.gov).

**CONSCIOUS DISCIPLINE**  
Conscious Discipline is a curriculum package and classroom management method that focuses on social and emotional learning. It helps students focus on regulating and explaining their own emotions and behavior as well as on interpersonal skills.

**CONSTRUCTIVIST**  
Constructivist learning is based on the belief that learning happens as learners are actively involved opposed to passively receiving information from teachers. Teachers provide the tools, guidance and experiences students need so that they can construct their own meaning and knowledge.

**EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION**  
The care and education for children from birth to when they enter kindergarten. Sometimes this term is used to refer more specifically for the birth to age 3 years.

**ELEMENTARY SCHOOL**  
Sometimes referred to as lower or primary school, elementary school starts in Kindergarten and generally goes through 5th grade. In Kansas City, a few elementary schools end in 4th grade and others continue through 6th. Please check the individual school listings in this guide book or on our website ([www.showmekcschools.org](http://www.showmekcschools.org)) to see if the school you're considering has the grades you need.

**ELL (ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS)**  
Students who are new to the English language or are working toward proficiency are called English Language Learners or ELLs.

**EXTENDED CARE/BEFORE CARE/AFTER CARE**  
These programs extend the school day with care, activities and homework time for children whose families need to drop them off earlier or pick them up later than the regular school day.

**EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES**  
These are activities that happen outside of the regular school curriculum. They might include sports, drama, art, robotics, gardening, student government, music, etc. Extracurricular activities are generally optional and not required by the school.

**HIGH SCHOOL**  
High school is typically comprised of grades 9 through 12.

**IB (INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE)**  
IB is an international educational program based in Switzerland and followed to various degrees in several Kansas City schools. The International Baccalaureate organization has specific guidelines that IB programs must follow in order for schools to be officially labeled IB.

**IEP (INDIVIDUALIZED EDUCATION PLAN)**  
All public schools (both district and charter) must create a specialized academic plan, referred to as an Individualized Education Plan (IEP), for children with special needs. They must do this within 30 calendar days after the child is determined eligible. However, it is important to remember that just because a child has a disability or impairment, they may not automatically qualify for special education services. The IEP process must be followed in order to qualify and receive services.

**INFANT AND TODDLER CARE**  
The care of children from birth to age 3 years.

**KCPS (KANSAS CITY PUBLIC SCHOOLS) BOUNDARIES**  
On a map, the residential areas served by the Kansas City Public Schools. A student's address must lie in the boundaries in order for him or her to attend the neighborhood, signature and charter schools described in this guide. Faith-based and independent private schools accept students outside of these boundaries. Check out the map on page 8 of the KCPS boundaries.

**LANGUAGE IMMERSION**  
In a dual language program instruction is provided to students in two languages. The goal is for students to be proficient and literate in both languages by the time they finish the program (which takes multiple years). Variations of this type of program are also called Dual Language, Partial Immersion, Full Immersion, One-way Dual Immersion.

**LINC (LOCAL INVESTMENT COMMISSION)**  
LINC is a Missouri state-funded non-profit organization that, among other things, provides extended care and other supplemental services to public school children across the city.

**LOTTERY**  
If charter schools have more applications than seats available, the schools conduct a lottery in which students are randomly selected. Once each grade is full, individuals will be added to the waitlist.

**MIDDLE SCHOOL**  
Middle school is the step that comes between elementary and high school. In Kansas City, particular schools encompass different grades in their middle schools. Some middle schools include 5th through 8th grades. Others start with 6th grade and go through 8th.

**MONTESSORI**  
Montessori education was created in the early 1900s by Italian doctor and educator, Maria Montessori. In a Montessori classroom, students are given freedom and independence (within limits) and teachers pay special attention to students' psychological, physical and social development. Montessori education is a constructivist model. Students are usually in classrooms of mixed age groups and have the same teacher for several years.

**PBIS (POSITIVE BEHAVIORAL INTERVENTIONS AND SUPPORTS)**  
PBIS is a school discipline method that emphasizes what students CAN do, not what they CAN'T and gives them tools to create positive social skills.

**PRE-K**  
An education program for 3 and/or 4 year olds, which is typically the 2 years before a child enters kindergarten. Usually a curriculum is used and the teachers focus on skills needed for success in kindergarten and beyond.

**PRESCHOOL**  
Usually refers to an education program for 3 and/or 4 year olds. "Preschool" often means the same thing as "Pre-K."

**PROJECT BASED LEARNING (PBL)**  
Students work together to explore big driving questions as a means to learning academic content and developing modern-world skills. Their learning happens through large, open-ended projects. Teachers act as guides and facilitators to develop the big questions and focus the learning and assess students' work through the projects they create.

**SCHOOLAPPKC**  
SchoolAppKC is a common school application designed to make applying to schools easier for families. To date there are 20 schools participating. Use one application to apply to multiple schools. Each year, the application will open in conjunction with the City School Fair in November. [www.schoolappkc.org](http://www.schoolappkc.org)

**SPED**  
SPED is often used as an abbreviation for Special Education.

**STEM/STEAM**  
STEM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. STEAM adds Art into that mix. (We've even seen STREAM being used! The R is for Reading.)

**TRANSITIONAL KINDERGARTEN (TK)**  
Some elementary schools offer "transitional kindergarten," or "TK." These programs are for children whose birthdates make them eligible for kindergarten and the parents and/or teachers have decided to give the child an extra year of kindergarten to support their development. Children in "transitional kindergarten" will move to "kindergarten" the following year, essentially giving the child 2 years of kindergarten.

**WAITLIST**  
When a school has no more seats available, but there are still students who are interested in attending, the school will put these students on a waitlist. As space becomes available, students on the waitlist are contacted and given some limited time to respond with whether or not they'd like to take the newly opened seat. In some cases, seats may open after the school year has started.

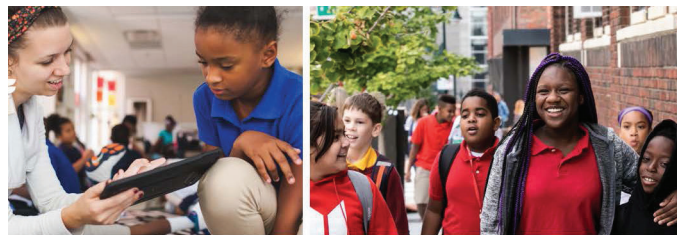

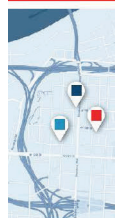

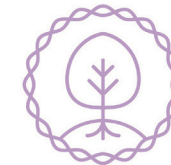
