



Learn

Sometimes finding out more about your school options can be confusing. Show Me KC Schools is here to help. First, let's find out what school district you live in. If you live in Kansas City 33 School District you have different public school options and are eligible to attend a KCPS district school, a charter school and many private school options as well.

QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF



YOUR FAMILY LOGISTICS

It is important to understand your family's schedules and routines to determine what supports will be helpful.

Determine what public school district you live in.

Does your family need school bus transportation?

Do you need before and after care for your student?

Where is the school located and what are the bell times?

TRANSPORTATION





Most early childhood and preschool programs do not provide transportation. Even though some Pre-K programs are connected to elementary schools, bus transportation usually begins at kindergarten. However, if your child qualifies for early childhood special education they may also qualify for transportation.

Do they use a curriculum?

How will children be prepared for Kindergarten?

Does your child need special education services?

Is before and aftercare available? Do they offer summer programming?

Does the pre-k seat guarantee me a kindergarten seat at a certain school?

ELEMENTARY

What are the grade levels served at the schools you are considering?

Consider your student's K-12 pathway. Elementary, Middle, and High School.

Are you interested in a specialized program like project based learning, arts integration, foreign language immersion, or Montessori?

What specials are offered at the school? For example: art, music, gym, band, or orchestra.

Is there a uniform policy?

What is the school's curriculum style or learning approach?

What electives are offered at the school?

Is a foreign language offered? If so, what languages?

What sports are offered?

Are advanced classes an option?

How many classes do students take each day?

What classes are required for all students?

Is there transportation for after-school activities?

Are you interested in a school with a college prep program?

Are you interested in having access to programs such as Industry Recognized Credentials or Career Tech?

Does the school have a robust athletics program?

Does the high school you are interested in offer the A+ certification program?

What course options or extracurricular activities are offered at this school?

How many credits are required for graduation?

How is school quality currently being measured and what is important to my family?


Here at Show Me KC Schools we do not rank schools.

Our mission is to provide you with all the information you need to make a well-informed decision about your students' education. Here are some data points that the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) collects on all public schools that can also be found on our website.

With this information, you can begin to build your picture of quality and what is important to your family.

1. MAP scores: (Missouri Assessment Program) are a set of tests that are given to students once a year in the subjects of Math, English, and Science. The MAP assessments test students' progress toward mastery of the Missouri Show-Me Standards.

The graph below shows the percentage of students who tested proficient or advanced in the state of Missouri for the last two school years. You may chose to use these numbers to establish a baseline for a schools performance.



SUBGROUP MAP SCORES

MAP scores for smaller group populations broken out by; race and ethnicity, socio-economics, Special Education students, and English language learners. If your student belongs to one or more of these subgroups, you may want to compare these scores to see how schools you are interested in are serving all students.

2. Attendance rates: Is the average daily attendance rate at a school. This measures percentage of students present 90% of the school year.




In 2023, 76.6% of all Missouri students were in attendance at least 90% of the time.

- **3. Graduation rates:** Is the percentage of students that are on a four-year trajectory for graduation.
- 4. 3rd grade reading scores: Measures the percentage of students who are reading on grade level by the third grade. (Third grades scores are important because it is the final year children are learning to read, after which students are reading to learn. If they are not proficient readers when they begin fourth grade, as much as half of the curriculum they will be taught will be difficult to comprehend.)
- 5. Growth metrics: Student growth is the change in academic achievement (as measured by the grade-level Missouri Assessment Program exams in English language arts and mathematics) for an individual student between two or more points in time. The Missouri Growth Model calculates how much students "grew" relative to predictions.
- **6. Student outcomes:** This measures the percentage of graduates who are college or career ready, percentage of graduates who have earned advanced or vocational credits, or percentage of graduates who are employed, in the military or are seeking further education six months after graduation.

Experience

Visiting a school gives you a chance to see the classrooms in action and to experience the school culture firsthand.

You know your child best and a school tour can help you determine whether a particular school will be a good fit. A visit also lets you decide if what you've heard from friends and neighbors holds true.

SCHEDULE AND MAKE VISITS





Three Ways to Arrange a visit to a School:

- 1. Contact the school directly to either set up a tour or find out when school tours are scheduled.
- 2. Visit Show Me KC Schools website at www.showmekcschools.org to view both prerecorded video tours and picture collage tours under the schools' profile pages.
- 3. Visit the events calendar at www.showmekcschools.org to learn about City School Fair, or School Saturday events that allow you to directly connect with school leaders.

A visit is also a great time to ask teachers, principals and other school staff questions. Please see pages 11-13 in this workbook for ideas of what to look for and a list of questions.

Be sure to take notes so that you can remember details that stood out for you. Pay attention to how a school makes you feel and whether you can imagine your child learning and growing in the environment.

Questions to Ask on a School Tour

A school tour is your chance to ask teachers, principals and other school staff questions that still linger for you after your other research.

- 1. What makes your school unique? How is it different from all the other schools available to me?
- 2. What is your policy on parents visiting the school?
- 3. What's the average class size at your school?
- 4. In what ways can families volunteer or be involved?
- 5. What type of organized, family engagement activities do you offer?
- 6. Can you tell me more about your special education and gifted/ enrichment programs?
- 7. Can you talk about the school's performance on student assessment tests for all student populations?
- **8.** How do you handle discipline and student conflicts?
- 9. What is the principal's background and how long have they been at the school?
- 10. What percent of your teachers have teaching credentials? What training is offered to those who do not?
- 11. What does a typical day look like? What outdoor time does my child get? What physical activity is incorporated into the day?
- 12. What skills and knowledge are parents expected to reinforce at home?

Things to Notice on a School Visit

There's a lot going on at every school. You'll find a list of things to look for in order to help you focus on what you want to learn from your visit below.

RIMARY

PRESCHOOL

How many students and teachers are in the classroom?

Is the space cheerful and appealing?

Are there learning stations or sections of the classroom?

Is there a wide array of toys and learning materials?

What is on the walls? Is student work displayed?

Is the furniture an appropriate size for young learners?

Are books available in the classroom?

Can students reach them?

ELEMENTARY

Do you hear a hum of activity? How are students and teachers interacting with each other?

Is student work displayed on the walls?

How were you greeted? What is the protocol for visitors?

What does the playground look like?

Are there outdoor learning spaces?

Do you see classrooms for art, music, and P.E.?

Are any students receiving specialized instruction?

MIDDLE SCHOOL

Is the overall atmosphere appealing?

Are there sports fields or a track outside of the building?

Is there a school library? Is it wellstocked and comfortable?

Is the school clean? Is it a place where you would want to spend time?

Are there specific learning spaces? A science lab or band classroom?

What is on the walls? Student work or upcoming event posters?

How do students enter the school?

Are students assigned lockers?

How do students enter the building? Is it secure?

Are staff members diverse? Will your students identify with them?

How are teachers and students interacting?

Are students working alone, in pairs, or groups?

What do you see displayed? Student accomplishments, awards, or trophies?

Are there specialized learning spaces?

Is the building clean? What is the condition of the bathrooms?

Are there sports fields, weight rooms, and locker rooms for athletes?

It is a good idea to apply to several schools. With the exception of your KCPS Neighborhood school, there is no guarantee in a given year that you will get into a particular school so having several back-up plans is always smart.

APPLICATION
